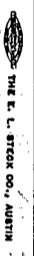

Soldier's Application for Confederate Pension

THE STATE OF TEXAS,

County of Anderson

I, Robert D. Box do hereby make application to the Commissioner of Pensions for a pension to be granted me under the Act passed by the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, 1913, on the following grounds:

I enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States and that I did not desert the Confederate service, but during the war I was loyal and true to my duty, and never at any time abandoned my post of duty in the said service; or (that I was in the service of the State of Texas during the war to protect said State against the Indians and Mexicans.

That I was honorably discharged or surrendered.

I was at home on furlough when war ended. My Company was Company I 7th Texas Cavalry, Green's Brigade, 3rd Regiment (Give date and cause.) in that Brigade

that I have been a bona fide citizen of this State since prior to January 1, A. D, 1910, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not hold any National, State, city or county office which pays me a salary or fees of \$300.00 per annum, nor have I an income from any other employment or other source whatever which amounts to \$300.00 per annum, nor do I receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value to the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does any one hold in trust for my benefit or use, nor does my wife own, nor does any one hold in trust for my wife, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the assessed value of over one thousand dollars, exclusive of a home of the value of not more than \$2000.00; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State of the United States, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

1. What is your age? I'll be 80 yrs of age, Sept 6, 1927

2. Where were you born? Talbot, Texas

3. How long have you resided in Texas? All my life except time was in army

4. In what county do you reside? Coryall Co, Gatesville, Texas

5. How long have you resided in said county? 35 yrs What is your postoffice address? Gatesville Texas

6. Have you applied for a pension under the Confederate pension law and been rejected? No

If rejected, state when and where Never applied

7. In what State was the command in which you served organized? Texas

8. How long did you serve? Enlisted in June 1864 Give, if possible, the date of enlistment and discharge June 1864

9. What was the letter of your company, number of battalion, regiment or battery? Company I 7th Texas Cavalry, Green's Brigade, 3rd Regiment in that Brigade

10. If transferred from one command to another, give time of transfer, name of command and time of service my Capt was Capt. Kit Horn, 1st Lieut Ben Boyles, 2nd Lieut Wilkins Lumbkins. was not transferred

11. What branch of the service did you enlist in—infantry, cavalry, artillery or navy? Cavalry

12. What is the assessed value of your home, if you own a home? \$1200.00 a lien against this for \$1200

13. What is the assessed value of your other property? None

14. Do you own any property other than that rendered for taxes in your county? If so, state value of same and county where located None

15. Have you transferred to others any property of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? None transferred

Wherefore your petitioner prays that his application for a pension be approved and such other proceedings be had in the premises as are required by law.

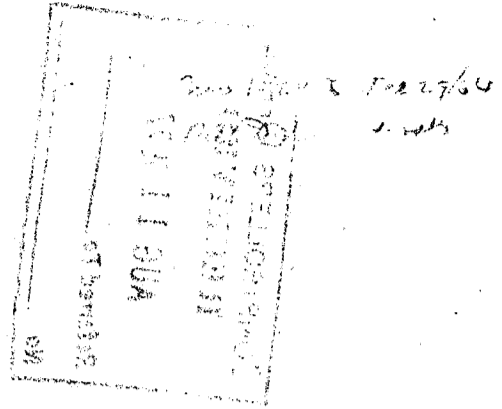

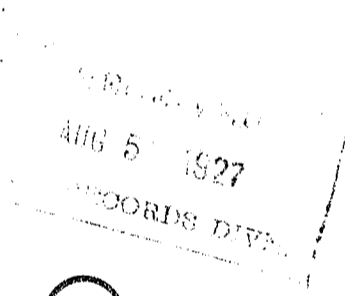
