D. 1899, the same being an act entitled "An Act to carry into effect the amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas, providing that aid may be granted to disabled and dependent Confederate soldiers, sailors and their widows under certain conditions, and to make an appropriation therefor," and I do solemnly swear that the answers I have given to the following questions are true.

And We each (below) further make oath to the following facts touching the applicant's service in the Confederate Army: (State fully your source of knowledge.)

I, J. J. Taylor am 59 years of age. I personally know that the applicant, J. C. Carroll was a confederate soldier. I lived in the same community with him when he went to the war. It was a matter of common knowledge that he was in the war. He came home wounded after he had been in the service about one year or perhaps a little more. The last time I saw him during the war he was so badly wounded that he was not able to perform the duties of a soldier, at the time it was necessary for him to walk on crutches.

And I, G. M. Carroll am 56 years of age. I personally know that the applicant J. C. Carroll was a confederate soldier. Applicant is my brother. I didnot serve with him but I was at home when he went away. I remember that my father went after him when he was badly wounded. He was brought home badly wounded and was never able to go into the service afterwards. I know that he was in the service when wounded, and was not able to walk except on crutches until two years after the war was over.



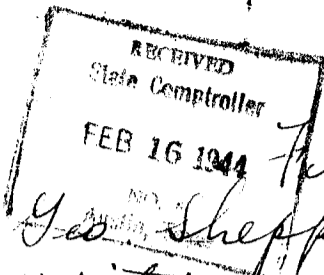

The records of this office show that J. C. Carroll, also borne as James C. Carroll was a Confederate Pensioner of the State of Texas under Pension File No. 20469. He drew a pension until his death on February 1, 1922. We do not have his serial number.

James C. Carroll was a Private in Company E, 29th Georgia Infantry, C. S. A. or Confederate States Army. He enlisted August 28, 1861 and was surrendered May 10, 1865 at Tallahassee, Florida and Paroled May 18, 1865 at Thomasville, Georgia. Discharged the same date.

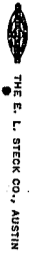
The application for pension of Mr. Carroll was approved on a report on his military service furnished by the Adjutant General, War Department, Washington, D. C.
