THE STATE OF TEXAS

I, H. C. Moore do hereby make application to the Commissioner of Pensions for a pension to be granted me under the Act passed by the 33rd Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, 1913, on the following grounds:

I enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that I did not desert the Confederate service, but during said war I was loyal and true to my duty, and never at any time voluntarily abandoned my post of duty in the said service; or that I was in the service of the State of Texas during the war, to protect said State against the Indians and Mexicans for more than 6 months. That I was honorably discharged or surrendered. I surrendered at close of war

that I have been a bona fide citizen of this State since prior to January 1, A. D. 1900, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not hold any National, State, city or county office which pays me a salary or fees of \$300.00 per annum, nor have I an income from any other employment or other source whatever which amounts to \$300.00 per annum, nor do I receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value to the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does any one hold in trust for my benefit or use, nor does my wife own, nor does any one hold in trust for my wife, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the assessed value of over one thousand dollars, exclusive of a home of the value of not more than \$1000.00; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and that I am not an inmate of the Confederate Home, and I do further State that the answers given to the following questions are true:

1. What is your age? 67 years
2. Where where you born? Webster County Georgia
3. How long have you resided in Texas? 32 years
4. In what county do you reside? Anderson County
5. How long have you resided in said county and what is your postoffice address? 32 years; P.O. Frankston, Texas
6. Have you applied for a pension under the Confederate pension law and been rejected? If rejected, state when and where. No
7. What is your occupation, if able to engage in one? Not able to engage in one
8. In what State was the command in which you served organized? Georgia
9. How long did you serve? Give, if possible, the date of enlistment and discharge. Enlisted in Dec 1863 - and served until May 1865 - about 15 months
10. What was the letter of your company, number of battalion, regiment or battery? Company B, 2nd Georgia - James Wilson - Colonel
11. If transferred from one command to another, give time of transfer, name of command and time of service. Never transferred
12. What branch of the service did you enlist in - infantry, cavalry, artillery or navy? Infantry



13. If commissioned direct by the President, what was your rank and line of duty?

A Private

14. If detailed for special service, under the law of conscription, what was the nature of your service and how long did you serve?

Never detailed - A Volunteer

15. Have you transferred to others any property of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law?

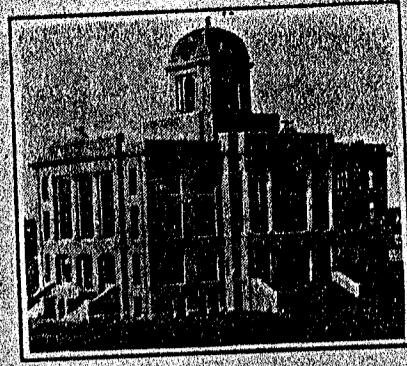

Davis, whom I certify to be a credible citizen of said county and State, and with whom I have been personally acquainted for the past thirteen or fourteen years, and being by me first duly sworn, upon his oath deposes and says that he is personally acquainted with H.C. Moore who is an applicant for a pension before the County Judge of Anderson County, Texas; that affiant joined Company B of the 2nd Regiment of Georgia State infantry in the month of March, 1864, and when affiant joined said company he found that the applicant, H.C. Moore, was a member of said company at the time this affiant so joined said company, and from said time until the surrender in May, 1865, this affiant served with said H.C. Moore; that this affiant, of his own knowledge, cannot say just when said Moore joined the army, but this affiant does know of his own personal knowledge that from said date of March, 1864, until the surrender that the said H.C. Moore performed the duties of a loyal and faithful soldier, that he, the said Moore, was a good soldier, never deserted the army or voluntarily abandoned his post of duty. Affiant further says, that as he remembers the date, it was in the month of May, 1864, that said Georgia State regiment was joined to Cummins' Brigade in the regular confederate army and continued as a part of said brigade until they were disbanded after the surrender of the confederacy. That this affiant served in person, as aforesaid, for fourteen months with the said applicant, H.C. Moore. I did not know any other H.C. Moore in the army.
