I am the widow of Henry Holder deceased, who departed this life on the 2 day of March, A. D. 1910, in the county of Anderson in the State of Texas

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband,* and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 2nd day of September, A. D. 1897, in the county of Anderson in the State of Texas*

My husband, the said Henry Holder, enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that he did not desert the Confederate service; I have been a resident of the State of Texas since prior to January 1, A. D. 1910, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. 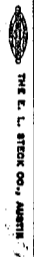

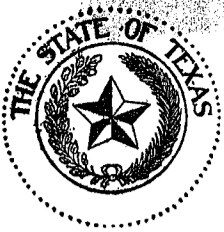

The name Henry Holder has not been found on rolls on file in this office of Company D, 22 Georgia Infantry, Confederate States Army, which rolls cover in part, the period September 3, 1861 to February 28, 1865, nor has record been found of the service, capture, or parole of a man of that name and organization.

It is deemed proper to remark, however, that the collection of Confederate States Army records on file in this Department is far from complete, and that the failure to find the name of any person thereon is by no means conclusive evidence that such person did not serve during some period not covered by the records on file in this Department.

Dear Madam:

Your application for Confederate Pension has not been approved on account of failure to show service rendered by your husband in the regular army, in addition to his service in the State Troops of Georgia.

As you are aware, the state does not recognize for pension purposes, services rendered in State Troops or Home Guards of states other than Texas.

Your witness to your husband's service, Mr. B. W. Camp, was in Company D, 22nd Georgia Infantry. A report from Washington states that the name of your husband, Henry Holder, is not shown on the muster rolls of this company for period covering September 1, 1861 to April 30, 1862, September 1 to December 31, 1863, and September 1, 1864 to February 28, 1865.

If your husband rendered five months service as claimed by you and by your witness, Mr. Camp, name should appear on last two muster rolls of Company D, 22nd Georgia Infantry. If he did not enlist until after February 28, 1865, you should file an amended affidavit so stating, and your witness, B. W. Camp, should also amend his affidavit, stating positively that Henry Holder did not enlist in the regular army until after February 28, 1865.

On receipt of such affidavits your application will be given further consideration.

Inf., C.S.A., which rolls cover the period Sept. 3, 1861 to Jan. and Feb. 1862 nor has record been found of the service, capture or parole of a man of that name and organization. Capt. Edwards has not been identified as of Co.D, 22, Ga. Inf.

The records show, however, that one William H. Holder, Pvt., Co. G, 6th. Ga. Cav., C.S.A., enlisted June 8, 1862, in Floyd Co., Ga., and on muster roll for July 1st. to Dec. 31st. 1863, (last on file) is shown absent, "Supposed to be captured, Nov. 1, 1863."

Union Prisoner of War records show him captured Dec. 3, 1863, near Knoxville, received at Rock Island Barracks, Jan. 6, 1864, and died at that place, Feb. 14, 1864, No. of Grave 491; locality, South of Prison Barracks.

Replying to your letter of May 25 requesting the military service record of William Henry Holder as a Confederate Soldier on whose record Mrs. Mattie Holder draws a Confederate Pension under file number 42918 Anderson County.

Mrs. Mattie Holder states in her application for Confederate Pension and also B. W. Camp a witness states that William Henry Holder was conscripted into the Georgia State Militia and that he was later transferred to Woffords' Command and was a corporal under Captain Edwards Company. They were later enlisted in Company D, 22nd Georgia Infantry and was discharged at Kingston, Georgia. He enlisted in 1864 and served until the surrender. The date of discharge is not given.

The application for pension of Mrs. Holder was approved on the affidavits of witnesses.

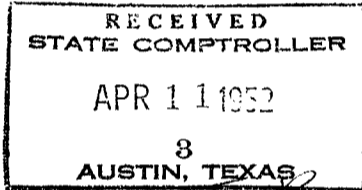
