I, J. P. Largent, do hereby make application to the Commissioner of Pensions for a pension to be granted me under the Act passed by the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, 1913, on the following grounds:

I enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States and that I did not desert the Confederate service, but during the war I was loyal and true to my duty, and never at any time abandoned my post of duty in the said service; or (that I was in the service of the State of Texas during the war to protect said State against the Indians and Mexicans.

Your application for confederate pension has been received but cannot be approved on account of the following unfavorable report on your military record which has just been received from the office of Adjutant General, War Department, Washington, D.C., where all muster rolls and other evidence of confederate army and navy organizations are kept on file.

"The records show that J. P. Largent, also borne as Largent, age 18 yrs., pvt., Co. E, 16 N. C. Inf., C. S. A., enlisted at Morganton, N. C., May 10, 1861, and was discharged Dec. 22, 1861, at Occoquan, Va., because of youth and general debility.

The records also show that as pvt., Co. D, 11 (Bethel) Regt., N. C. Inf., C. S. A., he enlisted at Morganton, May 10, 1862, and was promoted to Corpl. Dec. 8, 1864, and reported present on roll for Jan. & Feb., 1865, last on file.

Union Prisoner of War records show that as a rebel deserter, he was received received Meh. 21, 1865, by the Prov. Marshal General, Army of the Potomac, was received Mar. 29, 1865, by the Prov. Marshal Gen., Washington, D. C., and that he took the oath and transportation was furnished him to Philadelphia. No later record found."

Unless you can show by the affidavits of two or more competent and credible witnesses that this report is in error and that you were actively in the service after the date of your reported desertion, March 21, 1865, and that you did not desert your command at any time, I cannot approve your application.



Replying to your favor of March 11th. in which you enclose application for pension by J. P. Largent, of Neches, Texas, you are advised that according to the information given in this application and also from the information given in the affidavits attached thereto, Mr. Largent would not be eligible for pension from the State of Texas for the reason that his military service as a Confederate soldier was rendered as a member of the Reserve Troops of the State of North Carolina.
