that I have been a bona fide citizen of this State since prior to January 1, A. D. 1880, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not hold any national, State, city or county office which pays me a salary or fees one hundred and fifty dollars per annum, nor have I an income from any other employment or other source whatever which amounts to one hundred and fifty dollars per annum, nor do I receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value to the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does any one hold in trust for my benefit or use, nor does my wife own, nor does any one hold in trust for my wife, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the assessed value of over one thousand dollars; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and that I am not an inmate of the Confederate Home, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

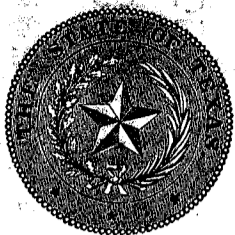

5. To the Fifth Direct Interrogatory the witness answers as follows: I am unable to give the official designation of the Company & Regiment in which said Moore enlisted & served in the Confederacy. I do know however that he did so enlist & serve, ~~however~~ & that he enlisted & served in a Company of soldiers formed at Monticello, Florida, of which Company a "Jim Manning" was the Captain. This was in the year (18) 1864; & said Moore served as a soldier in said

Company for about seven months—

6. To the Sixth Direct Interrogatory the witness answers as follows: Sais Moore was never, so far as I know, Commissioner or an officer, either direct, or indirectly of the President of the Confederate States.

To the First Cross-Interrogatory the witness answers as follows: The source of my knowledge as to the matters I have testified about in answer to the Direct Interrogatories is as follows, — I do not know these things of my own knowledge, but I know that ^{Sais Moore} he left home stating that he was going to enlist in the army & that he remained away about 7 months that my father & uncles with my brother (Sais Moore), for enlisting in the Confederate army, & that it was commonly talked in my Father's family that Sais Moore had so enlisted.
