I, J. N. Myers do hereby make application to the Commissioner of Pensions for a pension to be granted me under the Act passed by the 33rd Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, 1913, on the following grounds:

I enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that I did not desert the Confederate service, but during said war I was loyal and true to my duty, and never at any time voluntarily abandoned my post of duty in the said service; or (that I was in the service of the State of Texas during the war, to protect said State against the Indians and Mexicans for more than 6 months). That I was honorably discharged or surrendered Paroled at
Gainesville, Ala, at close of war in
1865 -

that I have been a bona fide citizen of this State since prior to January 1, A. D. 1900, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not hold any National, State, city or county office which pays me a salary or fees of \$300.00 per annum, nor have I an income from any other employment or other source whatever which amounts to \$300.00 per annum, nor do I receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value to the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does any one hold in trust for my benefit or use, nor does my wife own, nor does any one hold in trust for my wife, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the assessed value of over one thousand dollars, exclusive of a home of the value of not more than \$1000.00; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and that I am not an inmate of the Confederate Home, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

2. Where were you born? Lee County, Miss
3. How long have you resided in Texas? Since 1879 continuously
4. In what county do you reside? Anderson County
5. How long have you resided in said county and what is your postoffice address? In Anderson County just 18 years - P.O. R# 1 - Montalba, Texas
6. Have you applied for a pension under the Confederate pension law and been rejected? If rejected, state when and where. No -

9. How long did you serve? Give, if possible, the date of enlistment and discharge Enlisted in 1862 - and served until close of war in 1865 -

11. If transferred from one command to another, give time of transfer, name of command and time of service. Never transferred -

The records of this office show I. N. Myers, not shown as Isaac Newton Myers, executed an application for Confederate Pension in the State of Texas on November 2, 1911, at which time he stated he was 73 years of age, born in Lee County, Mississippi. He had resided in Texas continuously since 1879.

Mr. I. N. Myers stated his company was organized in the State of Mississippi and that he enlisted in Company M (Jacketts Company, Wood's Regiment of Cavalry).

On the above information a request was made to the Adjutant General, War Department, Washington, D. C. for the military service record of Mr. Myers. The report follows:

"The Confederate records show that I. N. Myers, private, Company M (Jacketts's Company), Wood's Regiment (Colonel Wirt Adams) Confederate Cavalry, Confederate States Army, enlisted May 3, 1862, at Canton, Miss. On the muster roll dated October 31, 1863, the last roll of the company on file, he was reported present.

The Union prisoner of war records show this soldier surrendered at Citronelle, Ala., May 4, 1865, and paroled at Gainesville, Ala., May 12, 1865.

The application for pension of Mr. Myers was approved on the above report from Washington and he drew a pension until his death in 1921.

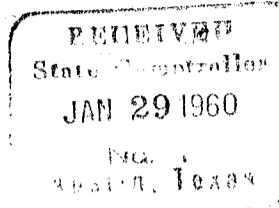
