Widow's Application for Confederate Pension

THE STATE OF TEXAS,

County of Anderson

I, Mrs. Mollie Poole do hereby make application to the Comptroller of Public Accounts for a pension, to be granted me under the Act passed by the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, A. D. 1913, on the following grounds:

I am the widow of C. J. Poole deceased, who departed this life on the 5 day of May, A. D. 1924, in the county of Anderson in the State of Texas

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband,* and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 8th day of November, A. D. 1877, in the county of Anderson in the State of Texas

My husband, the said C. J. Poole, enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that he did not desert the Confederate service. I have been a resident of the State of Texas since prior to January 1, A. D. 1910, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value above the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does anyone hold in trust for my benefit or use, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the value of one thousand dollars, exclusive of the home of the value of not over \$2000; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

3. How long have you resided in the State of Texas? 55 yrs.
4. How long have you resided in the county of your present residence? 55 yrs.

If rejected, state when and where.
7. Did your husband draw a pension? no If so, give his file number.
8. What is your husband's full name? Charles Jefferson Poole
9. In what State was your husband's command originally organized? Georgia
10. How long did your husband serve? 4 yrs If known to you, give date of enlistment and discharge Dont know
11. What was the name or letter of the company, or number of the regiment in which your husband served? If he was transferred from one branch of service to another, give time of transfer, description of command and time of service, (If applicant's husband was a pensioner give his file number, which is evidence sufficient for proof of service) Co. "F" 40 Georgia, and transferred to Co. "A" 66 Alabama
12. Name branch of service in which your husband served, whether infantry, cavalry, artillery, or the navy, or if commissioned as an officer by the President, his rank and line of duty, or if detailed for special service, under the law of conscription, the nature of such service, and time of service. Infantry
13. Do you own any property other than that rendered for taxes in your county? If so, state value of same and county where located. no.
14. Have you transferred to another any property of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? no.

Wherefore your petitioner prays that her application for a pension may be approved and such other proceedings be had in the premises as required by law. (TX)

Dear Madam:

Your application for confederate pension has not been approved since you have failed to furnish sufficient proof of your husband's service and the records in Washington fail to show service rendered by him. I am today in receipt of the following report from Washington.

"The name C. J. Poole has not been found on the muster rolls of Co. F, 40th Georgia Inf., C.S.A., which rolls cover in part the period from March 27, 1862 to Dec. 31, 1863. Nor has any record been found of his service, capture or parole as of that organization.

The 66th Ala. Inf., C.S.A., has not been identified.

One C. F. Poole, (also borne as C. J. Poole, on the records) who enlisted in Macon Co., served in Co. K, 63rd Ala. Inf. C.S.A. (2nd Ala. Reserves).

Residence is shown as Butler Co., Ala., also Milledgeville, Ga."

The records of Co. F, 40th Ga. Inf., covering period from March 27, 1862 to December 31, 1863 should show his name and service if he were with that organization at any time during period stated.

Paragraph 3 of report covers service of C. F. or C. J. Poole enlisted from Butler County, Alabama, also Milledgeville, Georgia, but since this service was in Alabama Reserves it must be shown that he served in some other organized unit of the Army, Home Guard or Reserve Troop service in States other than Texas not being recognized by the Pension Laws of this State.

If Mr. Poole were in the 66th Alabama Infantry as stated by G. W. Still you will have Mr. Still amend his affidavit showing in detail when and where he first saw Mr. Poole in the service and when and where they were last seen in the service together, and give other details of their service together if possible. On receipt of this information your application will be given further consideration.
