Widow's Application for Confederate Pension

THE STATE OF TEXAS,

County of Anderson

I, Mrs. Endora Singletary do hereby make application to the Comptroller of Public Accounts for a pension, to be granted me under the Act passed by the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, A. D. 1913, on the following grounds:

I am the widow of J. N. Singletary deceased, who departed this life on the 29 day of Jan, A. D. 1923, in the county of Anderson in the State of Texas

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband,* and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 9th day of April, A. D. 1905, in the county of Smith in the State of Texas

My husband, the said J. N. Singletary, enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that he did not desert the Confederate service. I have been a resident of the State of Texas since prior to January 1, A. D. 1910, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value above the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does anyone hold in trust for my benefit or use, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the value of one thousand dollars, exclusive of the home of the value of not over \$2000; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

1. What is your age? 66 yrs.
2. Where were you born? Hinds Co. Mississippi
3. How long have you resided in the State of Texas? 21 yrs.
4. How long have you resided in the county of your present residence? 20 yrs.
5. What is your postoffice address? Palatine Texas Rt #7
6. Did your husband draw a pension? yes If so, give his file number 13188
7. What is your husband's full name? Isaac Newton Singletary
8. In what State was your husband's command originally organized? Georgia
9. How long did your husband serve? 4 yrs. If known to you, give date of enlistment and discharge See # 13188
10. What was the name or letter of the company, or number of the regiment in which your husband served? If he was transferred from one branch of service to another, give time of transfer, description of command and time of service, (If applicant's husband was a pensioner give his file number, which is evidence sufficient for proof of service.) See # 13188

11. Name branch of service in which your husband served, whether infantry, cavalry, artillery, or the navy, or if commissioned as an officer by the President, his rank and line of duty, or if detailed for special service, under the law of conscription, the nature of such service, and time of service. Artillery

12. Have you transferred to another any property of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? No.

Wherefore your petitioner prays that her application for a pension may be approved and such other proceedings be had in the premises as required by law.

Dear Mrs. Singletary:

I acknowledge receipt of your letter of December 12 in which you state you are leaving Texas on December 13, 1938 for a visit to Oklahoma City.

You are advised the law of Texas permits Confederate Pensioners to temporarily leave the State on a visit or otherwise for a period of not more than six months, during which time your right as a pensioner is not effected except that no warrants will be issued to you during your absence. If you should return to Texas within six months from the date of leaving then after your return back warrants will be issued you for the time you have been absent, but if for any reason you remain out of Texas longer than six months no further warrants will issue while you are so absent.

When you have returned to Texas please notify this office of the exact date of your return.

No further warrants will be issued you so long as you are absent from the State of Texas.

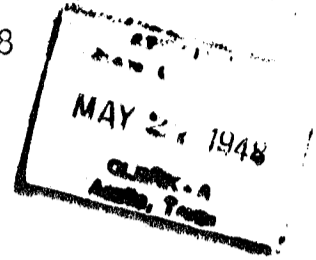

I acknowledge receipt of your letter of May 25 requesting information in regard to the endorsement on Confederate Pension warrants issued to Mrs. Eudora E. Singletary.

Mrs. Singletary may endorse her warrants by mark and have two disinterested persons to act as witnesses and I am sure it will be satisfactory to the State Treasurer who pays the warrants.

You ask if Texas has a Home for widows of Confederate Soldiers. You are advised that this State has a Home for Confederate widows in Austin, Texas. I suggest that you write Mrs. Susan Butler, Superintendent, Women's Confederate Home, Austin, Texas for all information you might desire and for blank forms for making application for admission to the Home. Confederate Pensioners who are admitted to the Home receive pension payments in the amount of \$25.00 per month or half the amount that they receive when living out of the Home. The State furnishes everything for their comfort free of any charge when they become residents of this Home.
