APPLICATION of Indigent widow of Soldier or Sailor of the late Confederacy for pension under the Act of May 12, 1899.

To the Honorable County Judge of Anderson County, Texas.

Your petitioner, Mrs. M. B. Mead respectfully represents that she is a resident citizen of Anderson County, in the State of Texas; that she is the widow of W. M. Mead, deceased, who was a Confederate soldier (or sailor), and that she makes this application for the purpose of obtaining a pension as the widow of said W. M. Mead, deceased, under the act passed by the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved May 12, A. D. 1899, the same being an act entitled "An act to carry into effect the amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas, providing that aid may be granted to disabled and dependent Confederate soldiers, sailors, and their widows under certain conditions, and to make an appropriation therefor," and I do solemnly swear that the answers I have given to the following questions are true.

NOTE—Applicant must make answer to all of the following questions, and such answers must be written out plainly in ink.

- Q. What is your name? Answer Mrs. M. B. Mead
- Q. What is your age? Answer 56 years
- Q. In what County do you reside? Answer Anderson County
- Q. How long have you resided in said County and what is your post office address? Answer 43 years

- Q. Have you applied for a pension under the Confederate Pension Law heretofore, and been rejected? If so state when and where. Answer No.
- Q. What is your occupation if able to engage in one? Answer House Keeping
- Q. What is your physical condition? Answer Weak from her nervousness and a cough
- Q. What was the name of your deceased husband? Answer W. M. Mead
- Q. Were you married to him anterior to March 1, 1866? If so, on what date were you married to him and where? Answer October 29th 1862 in Anderson County Texas
- Q. What was the date of his death? Answer November 25th 1895-
- Q. Are you unmarried, and have you so remained unmarried since the death of your said husband for whose services you claim a pension? Answer Yes
- Q. State in what company and regiment your deceased husband for whose services you claim a pension enlisted in the Confederate Army, and the time of his service therein? Answer Company "D" 7th Texas Cavalry served about 1 year, was discharged then in 1863 enlisted in Company "E" 3rd Texas Cavalry served about 2 year in this
- Q. If your deceased husband served in the Confederate Navy, state when and where, and the time of such service? Answer No.
- Q. State whether or not you have received any pension or veteran donation land certificate under any previous law, and if you answer in the affirmative state what pension or veteran donation land certificate you have so received. Answer None



Q. What real and personal property do you now own, and what is the present value of such property? Give list of such property and value. Answer. 50 acres of land of the value seventy five dollars, 2 cows and one calf value of \$40.00 and one buggy & horse value of thirty five dollars all being community property

Q. What property, and what was the value thereof have you sold or conveyed within two years prior to the date of this application? Answer. None

Q. What income, if any, do you receive? Answer. None except from little farm

Q. Are you in indigent circumstances; that is, are you in actual want, and destitute of property and means of subsistence? Answer. not wholly so, but not sufficient to get a comfortable living

Q. Are you unable by your labor to earn a support? Answer. I am

Q. Have you transferred to others any property of value of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? Answer. No

Q. Did your deceased husband for whose services you claim a pension, ever desert the Confederacy? Answer. No

Q. Have you been continuously since the first day of ~~January~~ ^{March}, 1880, a bona fide resident citizen of this State? Answer. Yes

The records of this office show Mrs. M. B. Mead, not shown as Mrs. Mary M. Mead, filed application for Confederate Pension in August, 1899 at which time she stated she was 56 years old. She was married to W. M. Mead on October 29, 1862 in Anderson County, Texas. His death occurred November 25, 1895. At the time of filing application for pension, Mrs. Mead gave her address as Bloom, Anderson County, Texas.

Mrs. Mead stated her deceased husband, W. M. Mead enlisted in Company "I", 7th Texas Cavalry where he served about one year and was discharged in 1863 and he re-enlisted in Company "D", 34th Texas Cavalry, Confederate States Army where he served two years. A private. The exact dates of enlistment and discharge are not shown.

The application for pension of Mrs. Mead was approved under pension File No. 7750 on the affidavits of witnesses who claimed to have personal knowledge of the service of W. M. Mead as a Confederate Soldier.

Mrs. M. B. Mead's death occurred July 1, 1921 in the town of Rochelle, McCulloch County, Texas. Application for the burial fund was made by a son, T. E. Mead of Rochelle, Texas.

No further information as to the service of Mr. Mead is given.
