Widow's Application for Confederate Pension

THE STATE OF TEXAS,

County of Anderson

I, Mrs. John Young do hereby make application to the Comptroller of Public Accounts for a pension, to be granted me under the Act passed by the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, A. D. 1913, on the following grounds:

I am the widow of John Young Jr. deceased, who departed this life on the 18th day of Jan., A. D. 1913, in the county of Anderson in the State of Texas

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband,* and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 7th day of Nov., A. D. 1861, in the county of Anderson in the State of Texas

My husband, the said John Young Jr., enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that he did not desert the Confederate service. I have been a resident of the State of Texas since prior to January 1, A. D. 1900, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value above the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does anyone hold in trust for my benefit or use, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the value of one thousand dollars, exclusive of the home of the value of not over \$2000; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

- 3. How long have you resided in the State of Texas? 72 years
- 4. How long have you resided in the county of your present residence? 49 years

- 7. What is your husband's full name? John Young Jr.
- 8. In what State was your husband's command originally organized? Texas

9. How long did your husband serve? 4 years If known to you, give date of enlistment and discharge Enlistment March 1861 - Discharged 1865

10. What was the name or letter of the company, or number of the regiment in which your husband served? If he was transferred from one branch of service to another, give time of transfer, description of command and time of service. 11. 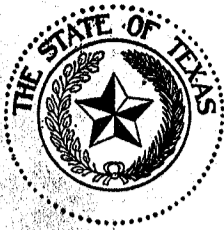

Infy USA, Muster roll for July & Aug. 1864, shows him absent, sent to hospital July 2, 1864. Roll for Sept & Oct, 1864 shows him absent sick since Sept. 6, 1864. Roll for Nov. & Dec. 1864, (last on file), shows him absent sick since Sept 6th, 1864. Prisoner of war records show him deserted at Richmond, Va., July 30, 1864, took oath of allegiance at Knoxville, Tenn., April 1865, and sent north to stay during the war, sent to Chattanooga Apr. 12, 1865. Other records show him present at Chimborazo Hospital No. 4, Richmond, Va., June 30, 1864. Furloughed for 40 days from said hospital July 28, 1864. No further record found.

I would most respectfully ask through you to the Gen. Commanding for a furlough of Thirty Six days to visit my family in Texas, as well as to attend to business which requires my personal attention. I wish to state that I am a resident of the City of New Orleans, and was agent for a commercial firm in that City, representing their interest in Texas a portion of ea. year (and previous to its capture I left for Texas, and joined the 29th Texas Cavalary, Apl 20, 1862). I brought out with me a considerable amount of assets due in the State of Texas, and left them in the hands of a relative without any special instructions, as the was is still progressing and probably will continue for Four years more. I ask the indulgence above to arrange and to give instructions to some person for these settlements, so that some portion at least can be saved. I have been clerk in Q. M. Dept. of the Regiment & Brigade since the organization and can refer you confidentially to my superior officer for the prompt discharge of my duties, I have received but one furlough since I have been in the service, and the distance to my home is 190 miles.



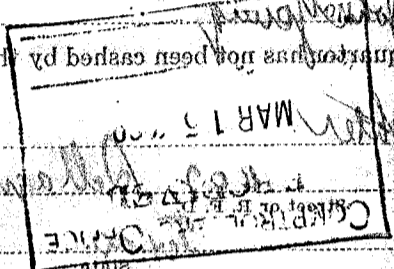
