Your petitioner, He M. Hogg respectfully represents that he is a resident citizen of Anderson County, in the State of Texas, and that he makes this application for the purpose of obtaining a pension under the act passed by the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved May 12, A. D. 1899, the same being an act entitled "An act to carry into effect the amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas, providing that aid may be granted to disabled and dependent Confederate soldiers, sailors, and their widows under certain conditions, and to make an appropriation therefor," and I do solemnly swear that the answers I have given to the following questions are true.

NOTE—Applicant must make answer to all of the following questions, and such answers must be written out plainly in ink.

- Q. What is your name? Answer He M. Hogg
- Q. What is your age? Answer 60 years
- Q. In what County do you reside? Answer Anderson
- Q. How long have you resided in said County and what is your post office address? Answer about 11 years

- Q. Have you applied for a pension under the Confederate Pension Law heretofore, and been rejected? If so, state when and where. Answer No.
- Q. What is your occupation if able to engage in one? Answer Farming
- Q. What is your physical condition? Answer Feeble from age and general debility
- Q. If your physical condition is such that you are unable by your own labor to earn a support, state what caused such disability. Answer Age and disease
- Q. In what State was your command originally organized? Answer Texas
- Q. How long did you serve? Give date of enlistment and discharge. Answer two years enlisted

- Q. What was the name or letter of your company and name or number of your regiment? Answer Company
"G" 34 Texas Cavalry
- Q. State whether you served in the infantry, artillery, cavalry, or the navy. Answer Cavalry
- Q. State whether or not you have received any pension or veteran donation land certificate under any previous law, and if you answer in the affirmative state what pension or veteran donation land certificate you have received. Answer No.
- Q. What real and personal property do you now own, and what is the present value of such property? Give list of such property and value. Answer None except one mule value of

and what was the value thereof, have you sold or conveyed within two years prior to the date of application? Answer *None*

What real estate has your wife in her own right, real and personal, and what is its value? Answer *None*

What income, if any, do you receive? Answer *None*

Q. Are you in indigent circumstances; that is, are you in actual want, and destitute of property and means of subsistence? Answer *I am*

Q. Are you unable by your labor to earn a support? Answer *yes*

Q. Have you transferred to others any property of value of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? Answer *No*

Q. Did you ever desert the Confederacy? Answer *No*

Q. Have you been continuously since the first day of January, 1880, a bona fide resident citizen of this State? Answer *yes*

Q. If you originally enlisted in the Confederate service from the State of Texas, were you at the date of the passage of this act, a bona fide resident citizen of the State of Texas? Answer *yes*

Wherefore your petitioner prays that his application for pension be approved and that such other proceedings be had in the premises as are required by law.

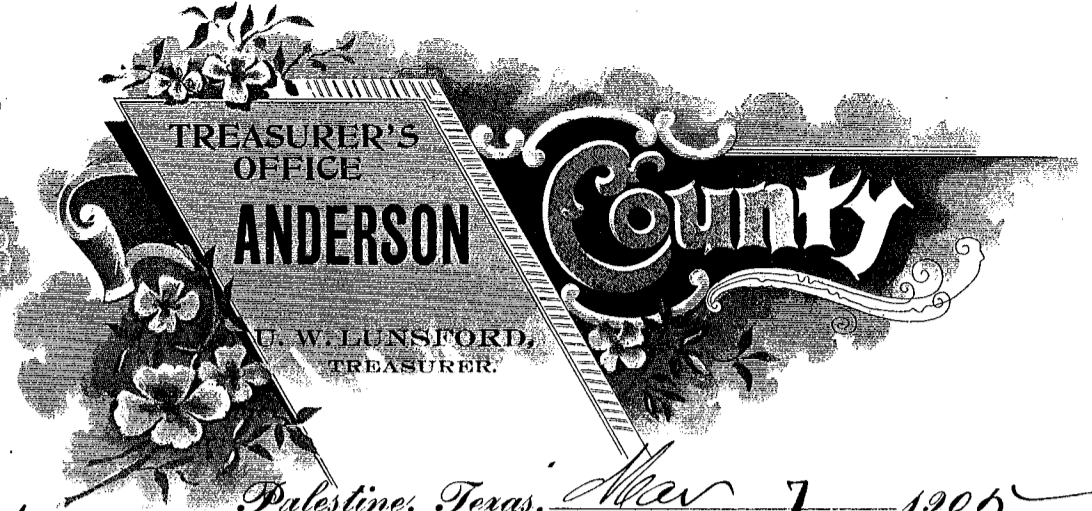



I am today in receipt of your quarterly affidavit, executed before a Notary of the State of La., all pension affidavits must be executed in Texas, otherwise they cannot be honored.

When you return to Texas, go before a COUNTY JUDGE, and under oath state the date you left Texas, the date you returned to Texas, and that at no time while absent from Texas, did you consider any other State your place of residence, and on receipt of this I shall be pleased to communicate with you further.

If you are absent longer than six months, you will lose pay for the time absent, if you return within six months, you will draw pay on your return for the time absent.

In reply to your letter of 23rd inst., beg to state that I should be only too glad to permit the warrant to be issued in another State, were it not that the Laws of Texas prohibit, a warrant being issued to a pension so long as he is absent from the State of Texas.

You realize that the law is a just one, as Texas pensions Veterans of all the Confederate States, and were it not for this restriction, we would be unable to distinguish who lives in Texas, and who does not.

As soon as the pensioner returns to Texas, and under oath states the date he left Texas as well as the date he returned to Texas, I shall be pleased to consider his request for reinstatement.

Hoggs application for a confederate pension was approved March 27, 1905 and he continued to draw quarterly warrants from the confederate pension funds of this State until his removal from Texas. This application shows that he was on the muster roll of Co. C. Terrell's Texas Cavalry dated February 29, 1864. The only witness to his service record is W. B. Hogg of Henderson County.

The number of Mr. Hoggs application for confederate pension in this State is 10578 and certificate covering the filing and approving of this application will be furnished you if desired in order to secure you a pension in the State of Louisiana.

We have no muster rolls or any evidence showing you were member of this company, therefore cannot supply you with the names requested.
