

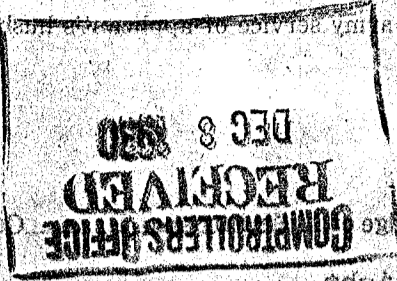

Widow's Application for Confederate Pension

THE STATE OF TEXAS,

County of Anderson

I, Mrs. N W Hunter, do hereby make application for a pension pursuant to the provisions of Articles 6204 to 6227, inclusive, of the Revised Civil Statutes of 1925 as amended by S. B. No. 27, passed by the Forty-first Legislature at its Fifth Called Session and all other laws of this State relating thereto.

I am a widow of N. W. Hunter deceased, who departed this life on the 1st day of October, A. D. 1906, in the county of Anderson, in the State of Texas.

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband; (or in case of remarriage that I am now a widow); and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband

and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 26th day of September

A. D. 1865, in the county of Anderson, in the State of Texas.

My husband, the said N. W. Hunter, served as a Confederate soldier (or sailor) in the war between the States of the United States; or (that he was a soldier who, under special laws of the State of Texas during said war, served in organizations for the protection of the frontier against Indian raiders or Mexican marauders); or (that he was a soldier of the militia of the State of Texas who was in active service during said war.) That my said husband served honorably from the date of his enlistment until the close of the war, (or until he was discharged or paroled in some military organization regularly mustered into the army or navy of the Confederate States until the surrender). He was honorably discharged or paroled.

That I have been a bona fide resident of this State continuously since the 21st day of June, A. D. 1845

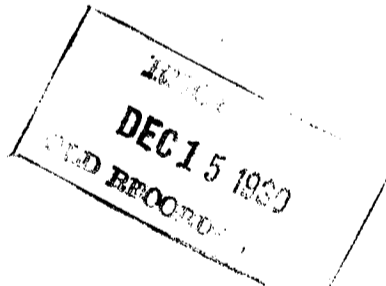

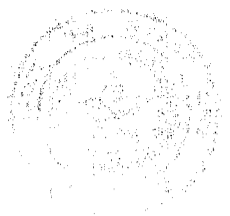

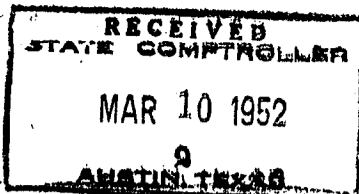

I acknowledge receipt of your letter of March 9th requesting the service record of Nathan Wyche Hunter, also borne as Nathaniel W. Hunter, as a Confederate Soldier on whose record his widow Mrs. N. W. Hunter drew a pension until her death in 1934.

The records of this office show Mrs. N. W. Hunter filed application for Confederate Pension in the State of Texas in December, 1930 on the service record of her deceased husband, Nathaniel W. Hunter as a Confederate Soldier. The application was approved under File No. 49070 and she drew a pension until her death in 1934.

Mrs. Hunter stated in her application for pension that she was born June 21, 1845 in the State of Texas. She was married to Nathaniel Wyche Hunter September 26, 1865 in Anderson County, Texas and his death occurred October 1, 1905 in Anderson County, Texas.

Mrs. Hunter stated that her deceased husband served in Company A, 2nd Texas Cavalry Confederate States Army. The application for pension of Mrs. Hunter was approved on the following report furnished this office by the Adjutant General, War Department, Washington, D. C.

"The records show that Nathan W. Hunter, Co. A, 2nd. Texas Cav., C. S. A., (2nd. Texas Mtd. Rifles,) enlisted April 15, 1861, at Rusk.

Muster roll Jan. & Feb. 1864, (latest on file,) shows him present. On extra duty clerk of Ct. Martial, a Private. Capture, parole or later record not found. Also served as 1st. Sergeant."
