APPLICATION of Indigent widow of Soldier or Sailor of the late Confederacy for pension under the Act of May 12, 1899.

To the Honorable County Judge of Anderson County, Texas.

Your petitioner, Mrs. C. J. Galloway respectfully represents that she is a resident citizen of Anderson County, in the State of Texas, that she is the widow of W. H. Galloway, deceased, who was a Confederate soldier (or sailor), and that she makes this application for the purpose of obtaining a pension as the widow of said W. H. Galloway deceased, under the act passed by the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved May 12, A. D. 1899, the same being an act entitled "An act to carry into effect the amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas, providing that aid may be granted to disabled and dependent Confederate soldiers, sailors, and their widows under certain conditions, and to make an appropriation therefor," and I do solemnly swear that the answers I have given to the following questions are true.

NOTE—Applicant must make answer to all of the following questions, and such answers must be written out plainly in ink.

- Q. What is your name? Answer Mrs. C. J. Galloway
- Q. What is your age? Answer 57 years
- Q. In what County do you reside? Answer Anderson County
- Q. How long have you resided in said County and what is your post office address? Answer 23 years

- Q. Have you applied for a pension under the Confederate Pension Law heretofore, and been rejected? If so state when and where. Answer No
- Q. What is your occupation if able to engage in one? Answer House Keeping
- Q. What is your physical condition? Answer Feeble from age
- Q. What was the name of your deceased husband? Answer W. H. Galloway
- Q. Were you married to him anterior to March 1, 1866? If so, on what date were you married to him and where? Answer November 21st 1861. DeKalb Co. Ala.
- Q. What was the date of his death? Answer March 28th 1891
- Q. Are you unmarried, and have you so remained unmarried since the death of your said husband for whose services you claim a pension? Answer yes
- Q. State in what company and regiment your deceased husband for whose services you claim a pension enlisted in the Confederate army, and the time of his service therein? Answer Company "B" 48 Alabama Infantry served 4 years
- Q. If your deceased husband served in the Confederate navy, state when and where, and the time of such service? Answer No
- Q. State whether or not you have received any pension or veteran donation land certificate under any previous law, and if you answer in the affirmative state what pension or veteran donation land certificate you have so received. Answer None



Q. What real and personal property do you now own, and what is the present value of such property? Give list of such property and value. Answer one house value of \$200.00 3 bags value of six dollars I have some improvements on one hundred and twenty four acres of Anderson County below land upon which I have never paid any thing except the district improvements are bare

Q. What property, and what was the value thereof have you sold or conveyed within two years prior to the date of this application? Answer None

Q. What income, if any, do you receive? Answer None

Q. Are you in indigent circumstances; that is, are you in actual want, and destitute of property and means of subsistence? Answer I am

Q. Are you unable by your labor to earn a support? Answer I am

Q. Have you transferred to others any property of value of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? Answer No.

Q. Did your deceased husband for whose services you claim a pension, ever desert the Confederacy? Answer No.

Q. Have you been continuously since the first day of March, 1880, a bona fide resident citizen of this State? Answer Yes.

The records show that W. H. Gal-
laway (also borne as W. H. Galaway
and as W. H. Galoway), private, Com-
pany B, 48th Regiment Alabama Infantry,
Confederate States Army, was enlisted
April 7, 1862, at Warrenton, Alabama,
by Captain T. J. Burgess, to serve
three years. His name appears on a
list, not dated, of Confederate pris-
oners of war paroled by T. L. Barker,
lieutenant-colonel 36th Massachusetts
Infantry, provost marshal at Farm-
ville, Virginia, between April 11 and
21, 1865, which list shows that he
was a member of Company H, 48th Ala-
bama Volunteers, Confederate States
Army.
