The records show that W. M. Blue, private, Company H, 51st Georgia Infantry, Confederate States Army, enlisted May 15, 1862. On the company roll for January and February, 1865, last on file, he is reported "absent, prisoner." Prisoner-of-war records show that he was captured July 1,1863, at Hagerstown, Maryland. His name appears on a roll of prisoners of war at Fort Delaware, turned over by Brigadier General A. Schoepf, United States Volunteers, to Lieutenant-Colonel C.C. Tevis, 4th Delaware Infantry, commanding the 3d Maryland Cavalry, September 5, 1863.

The records of Company D, 3d Regiment Maryland Cavalry, show that W. M.
Blue (name also borne as Washington M.
Blue) was enrolled Mass. 1863, at
Fort Delaware, Delaware, and mustered
into the United States service September 15, 1863, as a private of that
company and regiment, to serve three
years, and that he deserted on or about
April 15, 1864. No later record of
him has been found.
