Attention Mr. W. D. Lawrence.

I acknowledge receipt of your letter of March 31 in regard to a Confederate Pension for Mrs. L. P. Byrd, widow of M. W. Byrd, who filed application for pension on March 22, 1937.

You state that prior to the death of M. W. Byrd he received a monthly pension of \$25 a month and his wife, Mrs. L. P. Byrd received a pension of \$25 a month.

You are advised the wife of a Confederate Soldier can never become a pensioner until she is a widow, under the law of this State. Mr. Byrd drew pension payments of \$50.00 a month as a Confederate Pensioner prior to his death because of the fact he had a wife with whom he was living and supporting. Mrs. Byrd has never received a pension.

In order for the widow of a Confederate soldier to be eligible for pension, she must be a woman born prior to January 1, 1873. The application for pension filed by Mrs. Byrd in March shows she was born April 28, 1877 which makes her much too young to become a Confederate Pensioner. It was for this reason her application was rejected in March, 1937 and she was notified of this fact in my letter to her dated March 22, 1937.
