The records of this office show one A. J. Cagle of Bullard, Smith County, Texas filed application for Confederate Pension in the State of Texas on August 80, 1918. The application for pension was approved under Pension File No. 25115. At the time of filing application in 1918 he stated he was 74 years old, born in the State of Georgia, but had been a resident of Texas for 29 years.

A. J. Cagle also stated he was a private in Company "F", 49th Alabama Regiment at the beginning of the war but this regiment was practically destroyed at Port Hudson, Louisiana and he was then transferred to the 27th and 85th Alabama Regiment of Infantry, Confederate States Army. He enlisted on January 2, 1862 and was discharged or surrendered in April, 1865 at Goldsboro, North Carolina.

The application for pension of Mr. Cagle was approved on the affidavits of witnesses who claimed to have personal knowledge of his service.
