Mr. Darby stated in his application for pension that he was a private in Company I, Young's Regiment of Georgia Cavalry, Confederate States Army. He emlisted in July, 1862 and served about three and one-half years. The exact date of his discharge is not given.

The application for pension of Mr. John C. Darby was approved on the affidavits of witnesses as no record could be found of his service in the office of the Adjutant General, War Department, Washington, D. C.
