I know that Camp Ford actually existed about five miles from Tyler and that the Yankees were guarded there by young men so reports go in this county.

There are some of the remains of the old fort there now.

I have known John Gibson for at least twenty-five years and I feel certain that he was in the service. He should have been getting this pension leng age.
