I, Jake Goodson, do hereby make application to the Commissioner of Pen-
sions for a pension to be granted me under the Act passed by the 33rd Legislature of the State of Texas, and ap-
proved April 7, 1913, on the following grounds:
I enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of
the United States, and that I did not desert the Confederate service, but during said war I was loyal and true to my
duty, and never at any time voluntarily abandoned my post of duty in the said service; or that I was in the service
of the State of Texas during the war, to protect said State against the Indians and Mexicans for more than 6 months.
That I was honorably discharged or surrendered surrendered at Saulsbury, N.C.May 26th
1865, and was paroled.
(Give date and cause.)
that I have been a bona fide citizen of this State since prior to January 1, A. D. 1900, and have been continuously
since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not hold any National, State, city or county office
which pays me a salary or fees of \$300.00 per annum, nor have I an income from any other employment or other
source whatever which amounts to \$300.00 per annum, nor do I receive from any source whatever money or
other means of support amounting in value to the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor
does any one hold in trust for my benefit or use, nor does my wife own, nor does any one hold in trust for my wife,
estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the assessed value of over one thousand
dollars, exclusive of a home of the value of not more than \$1000.00; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other
State, or from the United States, or from any other cource, and that I am not an inmate of the Confederate Home,
and I do further State that the answers given to the following questions are true:

I acknowledge receipt of your letter of August 51, 1942 in which you request the military service record of one Jacob Goodson or Jake Goodson.

The records of this office show that one Jake Goodson of Flint, Texas Smith County drew a Confederate Pension from the State of Texas under pension file number 23956.

The application for pension of Jake Goodson states that he enlicted as a private in August 10, 1861 in Company A, 19th Alabama Regiment of Infantry, Day's Brigade, Confederate States Army. He served until May 26, 1865.

The application for pension of Mr. Goodson was approved on the affidavits of witnesses.
