It is shown by the records of this office that one <u>Wallace</u> W. Harper, private, Company A, 19th Alabama Infantry, C. S. A., was enlisted August 10, 1861, at Gordo, Alabama, to serve three years. On a return of the regiment for November, 1862, he is reported "On extra duty at Adjutant's Office." No later record of him has been found as of this organization.

The records also show that one Wallace W. Harper, private, Captain Phelan's Company, Alabama Light Artillery, C. S. A., was enlisted January 18, 1864. He surrendered at Citronelle, Alabama, May 4, 1865, and was paroled at Meridian, Mississippi, May 10, 1865.
