THE STATE OF TEXAS

County of Smith

I, Geo. M. Johnson, do hereby make application to the Commissioner of Pensions for a pension to be granted me under the Act passed by the 33rd Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, 1913, on the following grounds:

I enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that I did not desert the Confederate service, but during said war I was loyal and true to my duty, and never at any time voluntarily abandoned my post of duty in the said service; or (that I was in the service of the State of Texas during the war, to protect said State against the Indians and Mexicans for more than 6 months). That I was honorably discharged or surrendered at the end and conclusion of the Civil War, on or about the 6th day of June 1865

(Give date and cause.)

that I have been a bona fide citizen of this State since prior to January 1, A. D. 1900, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not hold any National, State, city or county office which pays me a salary or fees of \$300.00 per annum, nor have I an income from any other employment or other source whatever which amounts to \$300.00 per annum, nor do I receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value to the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does any one hold in trust for my benefit or use, nor does my wife own, nor does any one hold in trust for my wife, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the assessed value of over one thousand dollars, exclusive of a home of the value of not more than \$1000.00; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and that I am not an inmate of the Confederate Home, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

1. What is your age? Eighty years old.
2. Where were you born? Fayetteville, Alabama.
3. How long have you resided in Texas? Sixty Four years.
4. In what county do you reside? Smith County.
5. How long have you resided in said county, and what is your postoffice address? Sixty two years. Post Office, Tyler, Smith County, Texas.
6. Have you applied for a pension under the Confederate pension law and been rejected? If rejected, state when and where. Never applied before.
7. What is your occupation, if able to engage in one? none. What is your physical condition? quite feeble.
8. In what State was the command in which you served organized? Texas.
9. How long did you serve? Give, if possible, the date of enlistment and discharge. from Oct. 28, 1861 to June 5, 1865.
10. What was the letter of your company, number of battalion, regiment or battery? Company D, 15th Texas Infantry.
11. If transferred from one command to another, give time of transfer, name of command and time of service. Never transferred from one Co. to another.
12. What branch of the service did you enlist in—infantry, cavalry, artillery or navy? Infantry,



13. If commissioned direct by the President, what was your rank and line of duty?

2nd Lieutenant.

14. If detailed for special service, under the law of conscription, what was the nature of your service and how long did you serve? **Was not detailed.**

15. What is the assessed value of your home, if you own a home? **I own no home.**

16. What is the assessed value of your other property? **\$1000.00**

17. Have you transferred to others any property of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? **No.**

Wherefore your petitioner prays that his application for a pension be approved and such other proceedings be had in the premises as are required by law.

R.R.Cade being sworn, states that he is 72 years of age; that he personally knows that applicant served in the Confederate Army; that he was a member of Company D, 15th Texas Infantry; that he served from October 1861 to the end of the war; that affiant and applicant served in the same company and regiment, and that affiant knows that he made a good soldier and did not desert;
