Your application shows that you have been a resident of Smith County about three months, and for this reason same could not at this time be approved.


After you have been a resident of Smith County for a period of six months, your application should be filed with this office, then your right as a pensioner will at that time have further consideration.






This letter is in response to your letter of the 17thm addressed to William Jones, R F D No 8, care of Charlie Jones, Tyler, Texas.


