As you were advised by my letter of October 21, 1986, your application for Sonfederate Pension was not approved when filed on account of your age, which was shown in application to be fifty-eight years.




The present Legislature will have under consideration a number of amendments to the Pension Laws, one of which will probably affect the age requirement.

Replying to your favor of March 7.

As you have been previously advised, your application for Confederate Pension was not approved when filed on account of your age, since the Pension Laws of this State require that Widow Applicants show birth prior to the close of the year 1861, in order to be eligible for Confederate Pension.

The Legislature has under consideration, at this time, a proposed amendment to the Constitution and General Laws, which if adopted will permit the next regular session of the Legislature to amend the law so as to permit approval of your application.
