The printed roster should have shown that his brother, Clem Lanier was dead. I am informed that Clem Lanier was killed in the battle of Murfressboro, Tennessee. Richard Lanier was captured and die at Ft. Deleware in prison. The captain's report is inaccurate in that it shows applicant to be dead and applicant's brother living in Texas. Applicant really is the party living in Texas. According to his idea he is the only living member of his company, letter and designation of which is made in his application.


Can you suggest some way that he will be able to satisfactorily show, by competent proof, that he is the living man and that he is in fact a confederate veteran?
